# **CITY OF AUSTIN**

**Transportation Public Works:** Public Hearing on ASMP Amendments

Austin is in the process of updating three mobility plans guiding the construction of urban trails, sidewalks, crossings and bike lanes across the city.

The Urban Trails Plan, Bicycle Plan and Sidewalks, Crossings and Shared Streets Plan are all part of the larger Austin Strategic Mobility Plan (ASMP), and the ASMP is being amended to reflect the changes. The three plans will update prior documents that were included as part of the ASMP: the Bicycle Plan (2014), Urban Trails Plan (2014) and Sidewalks Plan (2016).

You can review the ASMP amend∀ ments online. The final drafts of the three modal plans are also available on the ATX Walk, Bike Roll webpage.

Austin City Council held a public hearing on Thursday, November 30, to consider an ordinance to adopt the three modal plans while making amendments to the ASMP and the Imagine Austin Comprehensive Plan.

# **Austin's Parkland Expansion**

A state-mandated change to Austin's regulations requiring new development to contribute to the city's parkland expansion efforts will go into effect Jan. 1.

# City of Austin Creates Technical **Advisory Review Panel**

ACEA Members Tapped to Participate

n March 2023, the Austin City Council passed a resolution to create a Technical Advisory Review Panel (TARP) of community stakeholders and city staff. This collaborative group working along with housing and development industry professionals to better align criteria manual rules with Council policies and, where appropriate, simplify the development process. The TARP meets monthly to provide feedback on proposed rule changes before they being the adoption process and considers way to improve existing rules.


A call for nominations from the community stakeholders went out last Fall. Nominees had to be technical experts in a discipline related to the City's criteria manuals. This included professionals such as civil engineers, architects, surveyors, arborists, and landscape architects that the anticipated time commitment of one monthly meeting. However, agenda topics will be grouped together so that if a member's expertise is not needed for certain meetings, they can choose whether to attend.

ACFA submitted the names of three volunteers, all active participants in the Regulatory Committee and familiar with the permitting process. We are pleased that all three have been approved to serve. 

### **PROJECTS**

# I-35 CAPITAL EXPRESS CENTRAL TUNNEL, CESAR CHAVEZ TUNNEL, AND US183 PUMP STATION - AUSTIN

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has selected BGE Inc. as the Design Engineer for the tunneling and pump station aspects of the I-35 Capital Express Central Tunnel, the Cesar Chavez Tunnel, and the US183 Pump Station in Austin, TX.

These tunnels and pumping stations must be completed before the highway construction phase of the overall CapEx Central improvement process begins. The pump station includes a pump house with customized concrete volute pumps capable of handling over 100,000 GPM, while the tunnels have a diameter of 22 feet and run over six miles.

### **BLUEJACK CLUBHOUSE - HOUSTON**

Quiddity was the civil engineer on the Bluejack Clubhouse in Houston that broke ground on August 15, 2023 and is estimated to be completed mid-June 2024. The 12,000-squarefoot structure (about twice the area of a basketball court) is framed using a combination of conventional wood framing, shop-fabricated wood trusses, and some structural steel.
