

# Austin Water Holds Stakeholder Meeting

Austin Water held a stakeholder meeting on April 5 and provided additions to UCM 2.9.1.F to further clarify CAV location requirements that are installed on reclaimed mains and force mains (4" diameter and larger). Contact Eric Langhout at Austin Water for any follow up questions.

### City of Austin Initiates Site Plan Review Process

DSD has embarked on a consultant-led work surrounding the site plan review process, working with McKinsey and Co. to set up a series of focus groups. ACEA is a critical contributor and has been invited to have representatives participate in these focus groups to convey members' experience with the site plan process.

### Technical Advisory Review Panel (TARP) Introduced

Councilmember Ryan Alter introduced a resolution to create a "Technical Advisory Review Panel" of community stakeholders and city staff. The panel will review the city's technical criteria manuals to identify challenges and improvements and, ultimately, work to make the creation of housing a little easier. The ACEA Regulatory Committee has already provided feedback to many of these manuals and will continue to monitor and pursue opportunities to provide input during review of these manuals

### Development Service Director Appointed

Following the retirement of Development Services Department (DSD) Director, Denise Lucas, on Jan. 31, 2023, José G. Roig was appointed to serve as interim director. Mr. Roig has worked for the City of Austin since 2007 in several roles. He was serving as the director for the Austin Code Department (ACD), where he provided strategic oversight and leadership to the department since Nov. 23, 2020. Prior to his work as ACD director, he served as a building official, building inspections division manager, inspections supervisor, and commercial inspector for DSD. Jose stays active in the code development community at a national and local level and has recently been elected to the International Code Council's (ICC) Board of Directors. Additionally, he currently holds several International

Code Council certifications, including certified building official, certified code enforcement administrator, commercial and residential building inspector, commercial and residential energy inspector, and property maintenance and housing inspector. He is also CompTIA Project+ certified and a licensed Texas code enforcement officer. As an alumni of Western Governors University, Mr. Roig holds a master of science in management and leadership, as well as a Bachelor of Science degree in business management, in addition to an associate degree of applied science in fire xcience from Kaplan University.



Eight of the sessions were recorded and are available on-demand. Even if you missed the event, it is still possible to register, watch the recordings and earn needed Professional Development Hours.




